Head Lice Season

Head lice are often identified in schools beginning in the fall. An increase in cases is usually seen about 3 weeks after Halloween, Thanksgiving, December recess, February recess, and Spring break. This is due to children arriving back from sleepover camps, traveling, and trying on Halloween Costumes or winter gear.



Head lice are photophobic and therefore may not be seen on the head. Signs to watch for with your child(ren) are intense itching, especially behind the ears and at the nape of the neck, live lice on the scalp, and/or nits securely attached to the hair shaft. Dark colored nits seen near the scalp are usually viable where as the white nits are casings for hatched lice.

Head lice are spread by direct contact, such as sharing of brushes, combs, hair ties, helmets, caps, hats, scarves. They are also spread easily at sleep overs, camps, places where a child's head rests on a seat, and other sharing events. Lice do not hop or fly.

Check your child's head frequently for evidence of head lice.



If you find head lice on your child, please inform the school, your child's close friends, and after school programs/day care providers. In addition to treating your child for head lice, be sure to include a thorough vacuuming of the furniture and carpets in your home along with the seats in your car. Additionally, brushes, combs, hair ties, stuffed animals, pillows, jackets, and backpacks should be washed in hot water or encased in a plastic bag for three weeks.

Again, to break the cycle of head lice, it is advised that parents check their child(ren)'s head frequently for evidence of head lice.




CORNERSTONE CORNER

This month's book, Stand Tall, Molly Lou Melon gives children a sense of control over things that happen to them by teaching them to use positive self-talk. The main character has pride in her personal identity and uses it to shield herself from teases and put-downs.



Conversation starters:

"What is the hardest thing about being a kid? What are you best at?"

Tip of the week: Practice noticing and replacing negative self-talk with an optimistic voice. Name and celebrate what you CAN do.

Last Friday, we extended this theme with a school-wide art project. Students decorated flower petals with words of pride and positive self-talk and we planted our paper flowers together, symbolizing standing tall together like Molly Lou Melon!
