Lastly, what follows are a few reminders from our office staff to ensure a smooth transition in the new year. I) Please arrange and discuss any after school plans with your child before sending them off each morning. It is very difficult to locate and interrupt teaching in the classroom for messages. 2) Call the attendance line (24 hours a day) if your child will be late or out of school. This line must be called even if you email or let the teacher know. We have a safe call procedure and all your numbers will be called to notify you that your student is not here. 3) Please send your child to school with his/her lunch or snack everyday. It is very difficult to have to locate and have that child leave their lesson time for retrieval of the lunch or snack. 4) Please be prompt when picking up your child after school. Please sign up for after-school care and have your child aware that they should go to that safe place when you cannot make it on time. Pick up should never be later than 2:45 on a regular schedule day, or 12:45 on a minimum day unless there is an emergency. 5) If you need to check out a student early try to let the teacher know by e-mail 24 hours in advance if possible. Then, come to the office allowing enough time for us to locate and have your student come down. Please do not call the office and ask for this to be done ahead of time. We will do this at the time you arrive as to not have the student spend more time out of the classroom than necessary.

Town of Los Gatos School Bus Service Feasibility Study

The Town of Los Gatos is exploring the feasibility of a local school bus service that is independent of the schools with the primary goal of reducing traffic congestion near schools. The primary consideration of the study include:

- Traffic Congestion Relief each school bus can remove 36 vehicles from the road.
- Convenience Neighborhood based pickup and drop-off balancing user fees with local transportation funds.
- Safety working to ensuring parents are comfortable with all aspects of the proposed service.

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Cornerstone Corner

This month the Asset Building Champion (ABC) volunteers will read When Sophie Gets Angry: *Really, Really Angry* by Molly Bang. Sophie is searching for ways to cope with angry feelings.

"She kicks. She screams. She wants to smash the world to smithereens." She eventually finds constructive ways to calm herself by running, climbing and being mindful of her surroundings and the elements of nature. Anger is a powerful and complicated emotion and part of being human. While anger has an evolutionary value in defending against danger, holding onto and accumulating anger is not healthy.

The goals of this month's lesson are:

- Identify, acknowledge and express feelings in safe, positive, healthy ways.
- Stop and think and choose how to react when our emotions feel out of control.
- Be able to switch directions and make positive choices.

To reinforce this lesson at home:

- Help your child identify and acknowledge how they are feeling with words. "You are frowning, is that puzzle frustrating? Can I help?" "You are using a loud, angry voice. Are you mad? Tell me about it."
- As a caring adult, notice and acknowledge your own feelings. Role model the techniques you use to stay calm and in control. Share your successful strategies with youth.
- Help your child chose safe ways to calm themselves:
 - Do physical activity. Put on music and dance away the anger.
 - Go on a walk or bike ride.


