






FACE & FIGURE DRAWING – 4th Grade

Message from the District Nurse

The flu season is quickly approaching. Following a night's sleep, it may be difficult in the morning to determine whether or not to send your child to school. The following are the guidelines we use. Keep your child home if he or she has:



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- A fever of 99.4 or more
- Chills
- Nausea, vomiting, diarrhea or stomach cramps
- Sore throat or difficulty swallowing
- Unusually red, watery, itchy or burning eyes
- Says he or she does not feel well

Please keep your child home if he or she is generally not feeling well or is unable to actively participate in school activities. Children must be symptom free, without any medication, for 24 hours before returning to school.

As a preventative and protective measure, wash your hands frequently and thoroughly and keep them away from your eyes, mouth and nose.

Please, keep your child home if there are signs of illness.
