PRINCIPAL'S LETTER

Dear Daves Avenue Families:

The state of California recently implemented a new method of funding public schools called the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF). The LCFF, passed by legislation and Governor Brown in June 2013, is a change in how the state of California funds school districts and the accountability structure that supports it. The change represents a major shift in that the state is moving from funding school districts with a "one size fits all" approach, to a new funding formula that provides extra support for students who need it most. School districts will receive funding based on the demographic profile of the students they serve and gain greater flexibility to use these funds to improve student outcomes.

An important component of this process is the district's development of a Local Control Accountability Plan, referred to as the LCAP. The function of the LCAP is to ensure that district funding is targeted to the needs of students, including the identified subgroups of English Language Learners, socio-economically disadvantaged, and foster youth.

The district staff has started the process of developing the LCAP. The plan's components include a description of the district's overall vision for students, annual goals, and specific actions the district will take to achieve these strategic goals. The plan will also demonstrate how the district's budget will help achieve the goals, and assess each year how well the strategies in the plan were able to improve outcomes.

As a valued member of our learning community, Superintendent Abbati and I invite you to share your input on the priorities established by the California Department of Education for the LCAP by completing a District survey. 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DAVES AVENUE K-KIDS ARE STARTING TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE APPLICATIONS DUE THIS FRIDAY!

Dear parents:

Most of us probably want our kids to be mindful and considerate of others despite the pressure and competition that our lives naturally bring with them. Project Cornerstone bases its work on 41 assets identified by the Search Institute. It has been shown that kids who thrive in life report having a large number of the assets. We are talking about very basic every day life "assets" like: family support, positive family communication, boundaries, expectations, role models. Of the 41 assets, only one serves as a gateway asset to several others: **Service to Others**. Children who serve and help others develop other assets at the same time: self-esteem, sense of purpose, interpersonal competence, planning and decision making, responsibility, positive peer influence, to name only a few.



If you look at the list of assets, some clearly refer to school life and others to the home life. We decided to bring the "Service Asset" into our school life to facilitate providing service to others. It is not always easy finding charitable work in which children can actively participate. Together with the Los Gatos Kiwanis Club we will

be launching a K-Kids Club at school. Our 5th grade teachers, **Mr. Martin & Mrs. Gessner** have kindly stepped forward to run the K-Kids Club at our school.

The student members of K-Kids will be in charge of identifying needs in our community and organizing ways to help. The adult mentors give guidance where needed to facilitate true practicing of leadership in real world matters. As the club will start being active after the Summer holidays, we are recruiting interested current 3rd and 4th graders for the **Daves Avenue charter launch on May 5, 2014**.

All kids from our school will be able to participate in the service projects the K-Kids Club organizes. Service projects will happen a few times each year and there will be opportunities for participation during school as well as outside of school hours. Parent participation will be needed for these projects and the whole family is invited to take part in the projects outside of school.


