PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Hello Daves Avenue,

This week I have two main pieces to share regarding our procedures for our upcoming Halloween parade on Monday and our updated Homework Policy.

HALLOWEEN

To make this another healthy and safe Halloween at Daves Avenue, here are some guidelines we ask that you follow if your child decides to dress up in costume:

- Avoid scary costumes that would frighten young children
- No weapons, blood, or masks
- No hair dye or spray
- Encourage school and age appropriate costumes
- Unattached parts of costumes can get lost easily at school, so you may want to leave them at home

If your child decides to dress up (it's optional!), have them come to school in costume. Children must bring a change of clothes, so that at recess they can take off their costumes. Kindergarten students stay in costume.

The annual parade around the school will begin at approximately 8:25. We invite families to enjoy the event! PLEASE help us keep the parade safe for everyone and respect the boundaries that are set on the Parade Map (at end of newsletter).

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DAVES AVENUE HOMEWORK POLICY

Current as of October 2016

Overarching theme and essential question: Is the homework we are assigning purposeful and meaningful?

1. Teachers may assign homework up to four days per week.
2. Nightly time maximums for homework (includes reading time):
 - K- optional with parent
 - 1st- up to 10 minutes
 - 2nd- up to 20 minutes
 - 3rd- up to 30 minutes
 - 4th- up to 40 minutes
 - 5th- up to 50 minutes
3. Children are required to read at home daily. Teachers will assign other opportunities as they deem appropriate per class.
4. Homework is:
 - Age appropriate and independently completed
 - Not tied to academic/content grades
 - A continuation or review of what is started in class
5. Teachers will teach students specific organizational management techniques that support:
 - meeting deadlines
 - developing good study habits
 - using their time wisely
6. Teachers will provide any necessary materials/tools for homework completion. Technology tools/programs will not be required but can be used as an enrichment opportunity; accessibility will be considered.
7. Parents should be involved in their child's homework to the extent of:
 - Providing a suitable environment where students can work independently.
 - Supporting homework routines.
 - Stopping homework when the student meets the maximum work time for their grade level or reaches a frustration level.
 - Communicating with the teacher their observations of homework completion at home.
8. Parents will be informed of homework through newsletters, web pages, student planners, and/or email.

MATH LESSON STUDY @ DAVES

This summer two Daves Avenue second grade teachers, **Rebecca Setziol** and **Megan Mahoney**, traveled to Japan along with 32 others from around the world to join an International Math-teacher Professionalization Using Lesson Study (IMPULS) Immersion Program.

During this program, they visited secondary and elementary schools in Tokyo and Yamanashi to observe seven research lessons and their post lesson discussions with simultaneous English translation.

“I have had 2 years experience with math lesson study and teaching through problem solving. I have also attended the lesson study alliance conference in Chicago twice. These experiences pale in comparison to the insights and knowledge gained through the IMPULS program,” said Rebecca Setziol. **“I found it very inspiring that an overarching theme among the numerous schools we visited was “nurturing students through mathematics.””**



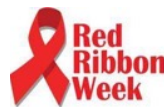

This allows OhmConnect to access ONLY the Smart Meter on the side of your house, to measure your energy consumption against their prediction for your house.

Right now Ohm Connect is offering a **\$40 sign-up bonus for our school for all new registered users,** PLUS each family earns \$150 per year on average. That means Daves could earn nearly \$10,000 if we get a whole bunch of families to sign up!
