Info about the books from **Mrs. G!**

Wendelin Van Draanen speaks to our 3rd-5th graders on March 23. She's written a wide range of books, and has a super website: www.wendelinvand.com. Kindness and humor are quiet superpowers, and it is rare to see them combined so eloquently.

3rd grade: The Shredderman and Gecko and Sticky series, each four volumes, are best fit for 3rd. Shredderman I (Secret Identity) won the Christopher Medal. It deals with one student's creative (and nerdy) response to bullying. Gecko and Sticky is a slightly higher reading level (because of a talking gecko with a Spanish accent). It involves dastardly villains, a reluctant superhero, and super powers. Their adventures make for lively, funny read-alouds. Reluctant readers enjoy the humor here.

4th grade: all of the above, and Sammy Keyes. Sammy Keyes is a detective, somewhat hampered by being in middle school. This 18 volume series also makes an excellent string of read-alouds. Readers enjoy them initially as mysteries, but many reread to revisit memorable characters. The order form has the first four, and two of Mrs. G's favorites (#7, #10). We had to stop somewhere (go #16!). I can reopen any of these, at almost any page. Laughter and compassion are everywhere.

5th grade: all of the above, and the stand-alone novels too. Flipped is told in alternating boy/girl chapters, as two neighbors grow from 2nd through 8th grade. It's about having a crush (or not!), family, and surface impressions vs. reality. Made into a movie by Rob Reiner. The Running Dream won the Schneider Family Award. Swear to Howdy and Runaway are slightly older. The former has fans in room 27; the latter connects to Sammy Keyes #3.

Secret Life of Lincoln Jones: Wendelin's latest, published October 2016. Best fit 5th, listening level for 4th also. Bank Street College of Education just awarded Lincoln Jones the Josette Frank award, which "honors a book or books of outstanding literary merit in which children or young people deal in a positive and realistic way with difficulties in their world and grow emotionally and morally." This book has a rare alloy of wisdom and (again) humor. I've been telling students since it came out that if an award were given for compassion, this author and this book should win it. Good for adults also, and as a read aloud to share. There is depth of character in everyone, often unnoticed ('secret'). If you have family members losing their memories, this book speaks with consoling humor.







February is Registration Month

Kindergarten and Transitional Kindergarten registration packets for the 2017-2018 school year will be available beginning Monday, February 6, 2017 at the following schools in the Los Gatos Union School District:

> **Blossom Hill Elementary School** Daves Avenue Elementary School Lexington Elementary School Louise Van Meter Elementary School

- Kindergarten: Children whose birthdates are on or before September 1, 2012 are eligible to attend Kindergarten.
- Transitional Kindergarten: Children whose birthdates are from September 2, 2012 to December 2, 2012 are eligible for Transitional Kindergarten.

A birth certificate, proof of residency, and current immunization records will be required at the time of registration. Only completed packets as described in the enrollment checklist will be accepted starting Monday, February 13, 2017 at each of the elementary school sites. School sites are not authorized to accept incomplete packets. The second (electronic) step of the registration process will begin March 31, 2017 with

an email notification to preregistered students Registration is not complete until the electronic portion has been submitted.

Orientation for parents of incoming Kindergarten and Transitional Kindergarten students will be held at each elementary school site on:

Wednesday, May 10, 2017 1:00 – 2:00 p.m.

District wide we are seeing an increase in the number of cases of colds, variety of flu viruses as well as bacterial infections such as strep throat.

According to the CDC, typical flu symptoms are more intense than those of a cold and can include fever, chills, cough, sore throat, muscle and body aches, headaches, fatigue and respiratory congestion. A cold usually has milder symptoms of a runny or stuffy nose, sneezing, respiratory congestion, tiredness and cough.

Strep throat is a bacterial infection and can be quite serious if not treated properly. Symptoms often include a sore throat which can start quickly, pain when swallowing, fever, red and swollen tonsils (with or without white patches), swollen lymph glands in the neck.

Follow up with the physician if you are concerned your child has been exposed to the flu or strep. Keep your child home if he/she is running a fever, has a cough or generally does not feel well, until symptoms subside and your child is well enough to fully participate in school activities.

Exposure to the flu and some bacteria cannot be completely avoided. However, measures can be taken to protect yourself and your family:

- 1. Thorough and frequent hand washing using soap and warm running water
- 2. Adults and children can use hand sanitizer (with 60 % alcohol) if soap and water is not available. Use a wipe on infants and toddlers hands.
- 3. Cover the nose and mouth, preferably with a tissue, if coughing and sneezing. Droplets and spray from a cough or sneeze can travel with great speed and

distance (6 -8 feet) and linger for hours in the environment.

- 4. Keep hands away from the face
- 5. Stay hydrated
- 6. Get plenty of rest
