PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

It's hard to believe, but the second round of Parent/Teacher Conferences is just around the corner. They will be held next week, March 5 - March 9. Restructured days have been calendared for the week with students in grades 1-3 being dismissed at 12:10, 4th and 5th will be dismissed at 12:15. All kindergarten classes will follow the AM kindergarten schedule Monday through Friday and be dismissed at 11:30.

Parent/Teacher Conferences provide an opportunity for parents and teachers to share information that will promote social/emotional development and academic achievement. Both parties bring their own expertise to the meeting. As parents, you are the experts on your child. You understand what motivates them: their strengths, challenges, dreams, and qualms. Teachers bring important information about learning styles, age appropriate skills, developmental milestones, peer relationships, and an understanding of where your child is on their educational journey.

In order to maximize the value of the home/school connection for student learning, consider these tips for a successful conference:

- I. Prior to the meeting, ask your child questions, such as, "What is your favorite subject?" "In which subject would you like to improve?" "In what subject have you learned the most so far this year?" Also, ask your child if he or she has any concerns they want you to discuss with the teacher.
- 2. Look over recent assignments and test grades so that you know how your child is progressing.
- 3. At the conference, ask the teacher questions to better understand your child's progress and needs. "What is my child particularly good at doing?" "Are there things my child is reluctant to try right now?" "Are their things that he or she does that surprise you?"
- 4. Be open to suggestions from the teacher. Check to see if there are things you can do at home to help your child be more prepared for school.
- 5. Share positive comments about your child and their experiences at school.

- 6. Expect to hear about something your child will be challenged to improve.
- 7. Share any concerns so the teacher can understand your child, along with any relevant information that may point to a solution.
- 8. Since conferences are tightly scheduled, please arrive promptly.
- 9. Please do not leave your child unattended anywhere on campus, inside or outside, during the conference.

As a parent, you are your child's first and most important teacher. Upon conclusion of the conference, be sure to share with your child what you learned and discuss how you will continue to help with learning at home. Also, ask for his or her suggestions. Thank you for taking the time to thoughtfully prepare and actively participate in your child's Parent/Teacher Conference. We are deeply committed to building a strong partnership to ensure your child's ongoing growth and success.

- How WE Can Help Make a Difference -

If you've ever walked or driven past **House of Hope** (next to Calvary Church), on Los Gatos Blvd, on a Saturday morning, you may have noticed a line of people patiently waiting. The people in line are from local families - families that struggle with poverty, homelessness, mental health issues, substance

abuse, or just trying to make ends meet. They come to the House of Hope for food and nourishment.

This small 800 square foot building distributes food to over 50 local families in need, every week. On Saturdays, House of Hope offers meals that are



generously donated, prepared and served by caring community groups who volunteer their resources and time. House of Hope also provides educational programs for children, students, adults and families.

Our school has an opportunity to collect various needed food items to help stock the shelves of the House of Hope food pantry. From Wednesday, February 28th to Friday, March 9th, the Daves Avenue Cool Cats will collect the following food items:

- **Kindergarten**: peanut butter (or equivalent) and jam/jelly
- First Grade: pasta and sauce
- Second Grade: canned beans (all types)
- **Third Grade**: canned fruit or fruit cups
- **Fourth and Fifth grade**: boxed cereal (low sugar and regular sized boxes, please)

Please place your donated items in the House of Hope food boxes located outside of each classroom.

Poverty touches many people at some time in their lives. And, although we may be helpless to change a family's circumstances, we do have the power to deepen our empathy to truly see the struggles others face and ask how we can help.





empathy, trying to understand others, standing in their shoes and feeling their emotions. This process starts from understanding different emotions! We tell the children that we experience many different emotions in our everyday life, and all these emotions are normal, positive and negative. What's important is that we should be able to identify our emotions and others' emotions, enjoy those pleasant emotions, and learn to deal with the negative emotions. Then through role-play, we ask them to actively pay attention to others' emotions, imagine "if I were you", and think of a way to respond. The best way to develop empathy is to be conscious about others, listen and pay attention. When reading a book or watching TV, or just watching others interact, ask your kids the questions "How do you think they feel", "What would you do in that situation". Gradually they will develop the habit of thinking from multiple perspectives, which is the foundation of empathy.

February is also the month of love – a great time to practice empathy!



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


