CORNERSTONE CORNER NOVEMBER TRAIT: BE AN UPSTANDER

In November the ABC readers will read "Say Something" by Peggy Moss to the children. The children will learn how to act when they observe bullying behavior. We will be working on moving from the familiar role of a bystander to the integrity-rich role of an UPstander.



If your child tells you about bullying behavior, always be there for your child as a good listener and take it seriously. Let us know about incidents that concern you or your child.

Encourage your child to go to an adult if they observe or are the target of any bullying behavior at school. Fun-Visors are always present at recess time to talk to.
