CORNERSTONE CORNER

Dear Parents.

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Last week, about 300 moms and dads (!) came to listen to Dr. Brad Sachs. He titled this talk "Creating Conversations that Change Children's Lives" - that surely sets the bar high! I am pleased we could get hold of Dr. Sachs' presentation and you can download it here (see the 'Presentation' link). Personally, I would recommend to scroll to the end of the presentation and read some of the dialogues he has with children. I am sure I am not the only parent that can very well relate to the "Minecraft" dialogue (slide 71). Check it out!

We all noticed in our interactions with our children that it is ultimately not WHAT we say, but HOW we say it and how we LISTEN. This is what determines our influence as a parent.

Have you ever had to deal with blame in your family? I admit, we get it. I trust I am not the only one. Dr Sachs' explanation of blame makes me rethink my approach: Children blame us not because of their lack of responsibility but because they feel so disappointed/embarrassed/ humiliated in themselves for not being responsible. They project onto us the feelings they are feeling. They would rather fight with us than with themselves. It's almost like a "Psycho-Dialysis": Kids throw their emotions onto us for smoothing/cleansing so that they can tolerate it.

The more you can develop a conversation style that is characterized by true curiosity, the more you nurture your child's "curiosity muscle". It will lead to the child having their own internal dialogues to weigh up different possibilities. This develops more maturity, reflection and independence.

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
DAVES STUDENTS ON THE MOVE!
